TSWBAT Objective

Given three examples of a Shakespearean sonnet (numbers 3, 6, and 10) and four classifications (iambic pentameter, octave, closing couplet, and ABABCDCDEFEFGG rhyme scheme), the student will be able to correctly bracket and label the four classifications correctly.

Learning Target

I can label examples of iambic pentameter, an octave, a closing couplet, and the ABABCDCDEFEFGG rhyme scheme.
